"Authority to Forgive Sins"

Lesson: Matthew 9:1-8

GOLDEN TEXT:

"When the multitudes saw it, they marvelled, and glorified God, which had given such power unto men." — Matthew 9:8

TODAY'S AIM:

"To see clearly the elements of this incident."

INTRODUCING THE LESSON:

Once we have believed in the Lord Jesus and His authority to forgive sins, it is hard for us to imagine that anyone would not trust His ability to forgive sins. Our lesson this week reminds us that the natural man does not receive the things of the Spirit because they are spiritually discerned. The scribes in our text were familiar with the Scriptures that speak of Christ, but they did not accept Him when He came, even though He did what only God can do. Eventually, it was the super-religious people who condemned Him to death for blasphemy—a charge they were thinking Him guilty of at this point early in His ministry.

PRACTICAL POINTS:

1. God wants all people to exercise faith in His power to forgive sin (Matthew 9:1-2).
2. We are held accountable for our thoughts as well as our actions (Matthew 9:3-4).
3. Jesus has the power to heal and forgive (Matthew 9:5).
4. Through faith in Jesus we have the power to follow and obey Him (Matthew 9:6).
5. Our lives should be examples of gratitude for the Lord's blessings (Matthew 9:7).
6. Through Jesus we may do great things on earth in order to glorify the Father, who is in heaven (Matthew 9:8).

CONCLUDING THE LESSON:

We may never see a miracle as obvious as these people did. Yet God may bring into our lives many incidents which, if we are paying attention and thinking rightly, we should recognize as demonstrations of His authority.

When we introduce people to the Lord Jesus, whether at our church, our home, in prayer, or witnessing in general, we have no idea what Christ might do. He may bring salvation—forgiveness of sins—or physical health, or both! We bring them to Him in faith; He does what is appropriate. We need to decide beforehand to accept what He does and trust Him for what is best.

We know He has the authority to forgive sins because He died to cover all our sins. He arose for our justification. Jesus would die for the paralytic's sins so He could forgive them beforehand just as easily as after the cross. He bore our sins and carried our diseases on the cross. We need no further proof.
