“Losing and Gaining”

Lesson: Luke 9:18-17

GOLDEN TEXT:

“He said to them all, If any man will come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me.” — Luke 9:23

TODAY’S AIM:

“To understand that being a disciple of Jesus requires a serious commitment, not a part-time infatuation.”

INTRODUCING THE LESSON:

Have you ever wrestled with the thought of who Jesus really is? Most Christians have dealt with that important question prior to their salvation.

In order to be His disciples, we must understand who Jesus is and what He expects from us. This week’s lesson will help us to understand or will reaffirm the identity of Jesus and why He came. In addition, we will see the importance of counting the cost of being His disciple.

PRACTICAL POINTS:

1. Build a godly circle of friends for honest fellowship and feedback (Luke 9:18).
2. Human opinions lead us away from God, while the Holy Spirit leads us to Jesus (Luke 9:19-20).
3. God reveals Himself on His own terms (Luke 9:21).
4. The world rejects Christ; it will also reject believers who faithfully follow Him (Luke 9:22).
5. Following Jesus is a daily commitment to make His priorities our own (Luke 9:23).
6. No material possession or earthly relationship is worth the loss of eternal life (Luke 9:24-25).
7. Live each day seeking glory for Jesus Christ (Luke 9:26-27).

CONCLUDING THE LESSON:

This week’s lesson took place in the vicinity of Caesarea Philippi, a city about twenty-five miles north of the Sea of Galilee. It was a center of pagan worship. It is interesting to see that Jesus brought His disciples to a center of paganism to ask them the question, “Whom say ye that I am?” (Luke 9:20)? The correct answer to this question is also the unpopular one. Does popular opinion influence your thinking, or do you think biblically?
