"Faith Without Works Is Dead"

Lesson: James 2:14-26

GOLDEN TEXT:

"As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also." — James 2:26

TODAY'S AIM:

"To understand the basic definitions of the key words in the text, specifically, "faith," "works," and "dead."

INTRODUCING THE LESSON:

The epistle of James was written by James, the brother of Jesus Christ, the son of Joseph. He was converted sometime after the resurrection of the Lord and quickly became an early leader in the Jerusalem church. He wrote his letter "to the twelve tribes which (were) scattered abroad" (1:1). This is a reference to the Jewish population living outside the nation of Israel.

The letter emphasizes practical Christian living, exhorting the readers to lives of consistency and sacrifice. Martin Luther found the book to be puzzling since at points it seems to elevate works over faith. However, as we study the epistle, we will discover that the author offers a balance between the two doctrines.

PRACTICAL POINTS:

- 1. Saving faith is life-changing faith (James 2:14).
- 2. Saving faith is visible to others and has an impact on those we encounter (James 2:15-16).
- 3. Our actions show the difference between true faith in God and mere knowledge about Him (James 2:17-19).
- 4. True faith moves believers to obey God and commit to Him (James 2:20-21).
- 5. True faith takes God at His word and acts on what He has said (James 2:22-24).
- 6. God can work through anyone who will trust Him (James 2:25).
- 7. Dead faith will not reach this world for Christ (James 2:26).

CONCLUDING THE LESSON:

James did not expect believers to read this section and set up an examining board to evaluate the works of others. To the contrary, James expounded this great truth in order for each believer to examine the reality of his own faith. Many people are living under the false assumption that they are saved when there has been no change in their hearts.

As a youth pastor, I spoke one night about the need to become a Christian. A young woman approached me after the youth meeting and asked me how she could be saved. I was amazed, for she had been raised in the church and active in many ministries. She looked at me with a blank stare. I recalled the truth that "the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not" (2 Corinthians 4:4). Give people the gospel.
