"Childlike Faith"

Lesson: Luke 18:15-27; Mark 10:16

GOLDEN TEXT:

"Verily I say unto you, Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God as a little child shall in no wise enter therein" (Luke 18:17).

TODAY'S AIM:

"To understand that the essence of childlike faith is unquestioned acceptance.

INTRODUCING THE LESSON:

Most of us have experienced or observed the following scene: Dad is in the swimming pool, and his young child is standing on the side of the pool. Dad holds out his arms and tells his child to jump into his arms, assuring the child that he will catch him. The child at first may hesitate but then jumps into his father's waiting arms. What does that scene tell us about a child's faith?

This scene illustrates the essence of faith. The child has complete and unquestioned trust in his father and will do something that he might otherwise be afraid to do. Let us keep this illustration in mind as we explore childlike faith today.

PRACTICAL POINTS:

- 1. We need to grow in wisdom and knowledge but remain childlike in our trust (Luke 18:15-17).
- 2. Our idea of "good" falls woefully short of God's (Luke 18:18-19).
- 3. Keeping the commandments is good but will never save us; we must give our lives to Jesus (Luke 18:20-22).
- 4. If we are holding on to the things of this world, following Jesus will seem an impossible challenge (Luke 18:23-24).
- 5. God has brought many camels through the needle's eye of eternal life (Luke 18:25-27).
- 6. Jesus loves to bless children (Mark 10:16).

CONCLUDING THE LESSON:

In our sophisticated world, we may look down on simple, childlike faith. We rely so much on our technology that we think the answers lie in our devices. We need to strip away all the layers of our sophistication and believe what God says—the same way a child believes his parents. "If God says it, then I believe it, and I can trust Him."

An acrostic of what is involved in childlike faith:

Come to the Lord as a child. Hand over the matter to God. Identify barriers to simple faith. Love the Lord deeply. Do not doubt God. Look to Jesus only. Initiate serious Scripture study. Keep a clear focus on Christ. Exercise complete trust. Follow the Lord without question. Allow the Lord to guide your steps. Invite Him into your life. Tell others of God's love. Hold tight to your faith.


